Our Church This Decade

As we come to the end of a decade, I thought it would be interesting to look back and see how much our church has grown in the past ten years.

Regarding our facilities, our immediate goal is to pay off Phase 1 of our 20-year Master Building Plan. Then we can begin planning Phase 2, a two-story 32 room children's and education wing on the back of the Fellowship Hall. When this wing is complete, we can make all our worship services consecutive rather than concurrent, so that we can fully deploy all worship staff at each of our worship services.

No area of growth is more important than these last two (youth ministries and children's ministries). Of the people who make a commitment to Christ, 80% do so before the age of 18. The purpose of the Church is to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world. Becoming a disciple of Christ and growing as a disciple of Christ is a life-long journey that involves every age of life; however 80% of disciple-making occurs in these first eighteen years. The Church must be proactive in helping families raise their children to be followers of Christ.

Currently, we have a part-time music director (20 hours/week). One of our goals for several years has been to hire a full-time music director, a ministry professional who can provide not only adult music ministries, but also youth music and children's music ministries, as well. Our current staff and volunteers with youth and children work hard and do well, but they are at the limits of what they can accomplish without a full-time director of music. 2010 is the fourth consecutive year that our Staff Parish Relations Committee has recommended making Bruce Nunley full-time Director of Music and Pastoral Care Assistant. So far, budget constraints have prevented this. As soon as our giving grows sufficiently, I trust that this ministry goal will be accomplished. This will greatly enhance our ministries with youth and our ministries with children, and with their families. Nothing is more vital to our continued growth in making disciples of Jesus Christ.

Letters to Our Congregation

Dear Fellow Church Members

First of all, I want to thank the Staff Parish Relations Committee for the confidence they placed in me by allowing me the opportunity to take on this huge responsibility. I also want to thank David Martin for his patience with me during my training period and for agreeing to stay on during the month of January when there are so many things that have to get done to close out the old year and to begin a new one.

As I begin this job, there are two things I would like to ask of you that will go a long way in helping me do the job:

1. I ask that you refrain from giving me anything of a financial matter on Sundays. Like you, Sundays are my day of worship and Sunday School Bible study and I would like to focus on those events. I certainly realize that there will be emergencies and I will respond to those accordingly. But, if you simply forgot to turn in your envelope from the previous week or you have an invoice that needs to get paid, please use the lock box in the main office door or my mail slot behind the receptionist's desk in the main office.
2. Please use the numbered envelopes the church provides for you. These envelopes enhance the effectiveness of my work and the volunteer counters. If you do not have a set of offering envelopes and would like a set, please let me know. And if you don't use the pre-printed envelopes, please write legibly on the check or the pew envelope so we can make sure we record your offering in the way you would have it assigned.

Lastly, this is a request that has been made by previous Financial Secretaries but I echo it now; please use two checks if you are giving to the Budget and the Building Fund. Again, this makes the counters' job much easier and it also ensures that you are credited appropriately.

I ask for your patience with me as well as I take on this very complex job. I won't always have the answers to your questions in the beginning but I will get them for you just as quickly as I possibly can. Thank you for honoring these requests. Let's make Winder First United Methodist Church financially strong in 2010, to better equip us to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.

Winder FUMC Church Family,

With difficult economic times impacting all of us, I believe it is important to share the effect of this impact on our church's current financial position. At our December staff meeting the finance committee approved a 2010 General Budget based on our pledge commitments from the previous November Consecration Sunday. For the first time in a number of years we have seen a decrease in congregational pledge giving from the previous year. In addition, 2009 giving year-to-date through November was less than our pledged commitments, and as a result could impact next year's cash flow and our ability to make on time payments.

Terry and his staff have worked through a difficult task of identifying ways to reduce spending amounts in 2010 by close to \$70,000 from last year's budget expenses. Areas impacted by this year's budget reductions include staffing levels, payroll freezes, and spending cuts to many of the church's program ministries and facility maintenance.

On a positive note, over the past several years the finance committee has put the church in a good financial position to "weather" this economic storm. In 2010 the finance committee will apply proceeds from the DeLa Perriere Fund, as approved by the Administrative Board, to reduce our building loan debt amount down from \$950,000 to \$550,000. This will reduce capital loan payments for next year by over 50 percent and will thankfully provide the church with additional flexibilities as it relates to the timing for the next needed capital campaign.

In addition, our church staff is taking a positive and creative approach to providing previous year levels of program ministries to both the congregation and community with the reduced program funds that are available in 2010.

The trustees are also looking at innovative ways to reduce building and grounds operating expenses during the upcoming year. As a congregation, we can help to make up the program ministry and building maintenance funding difference in 2010 not only with our regular monetary giving, but also by assisting the church staff with the volunteer giving of our time and our talents. I encourage each of us to talk to staff and committee leaders to find out how we can make a difference. A listing of the ministry committees and leaders can be found in the 2010 church handbook that will be given out at Charge Conference on January 18th and is available for any church member who requests it from the church office anytime throughout the year.

I would like to thank each of you for your continued giving and volunteer support to the ministries of the church that enable us to bring others to Christ.

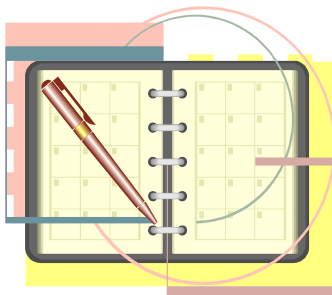

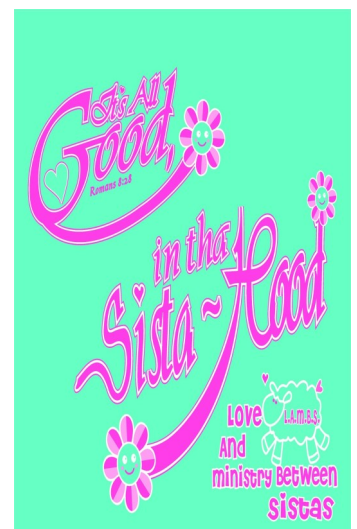
